Partner Story from Maria Rosa Zitha in Mozambique

Maria Rosa Zitha is a 56-year-old widow, she has 3 children and 14 grandchildren, and she has been a community partner of the Epicenter in Chokwe since 2006. The highlight for her is to enhance her leadership and entrepreneurial qualities. She has served as the chair of the microfinance committee and is currently the vice chair of the Epicenter committee.

Along these years, the construction of her own house, the purchase of livestock and the training in agro processing,

tailoring and the production of building bricks are some of the achievements that have proudly marked the recent times as a community partner of THP Mozambique. As a result of these trainings she decided to start her own business (production of bricks for sale). With the business she has been supporting her family for 5 years, has served as a trainer for trainers for others and has trained animators in the Zuza Epicenter (another Epicenter in Mozambique). Most recently, Mrs. Maria played a decisive role in the process of implementing activities to create assets for the resilience



of communities. She led with success the process of installing the irrigation system and preparing the field through the mobilization of other partners in the community.
